The Attorney General's office offers help to victims of a variety of crimes in North Carolina. The Address Confidentiality Program helps victims keep their address safe from abusers. The program gives anonymity to survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking. Under North Carolina law, crime victims are supposed to be the first in line for payment when criminals pay restitution to the court. If a criminal who harmed you owes you restitution, the Office of Victims and Citizens Services may be able to help.
